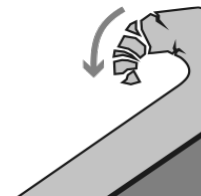

Wind Slab



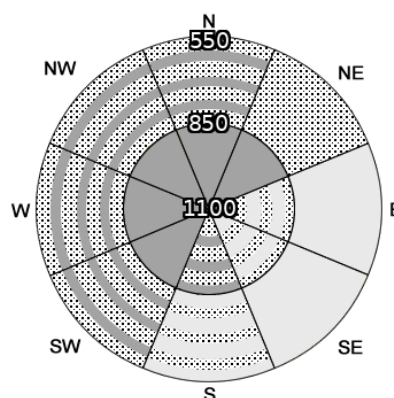

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Drifting will continue to deposit unstable windslab onto existing poorly bonded windslab. Greatest accumulations will be on South-West through West and North to North-East aspects above 850 metres where avalanches are likely. Cornices above these aspects will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

It is expected to be dry throughout the forecast period with strong Easterly winds. It will remain freezing at all levels.

Comments

Sugar-like facets in the snowpack are widespread; including as a persistent deep weak layer and in shallower more recent deposits.
