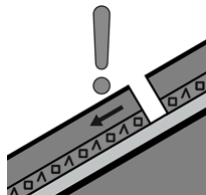
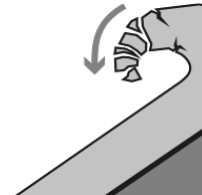
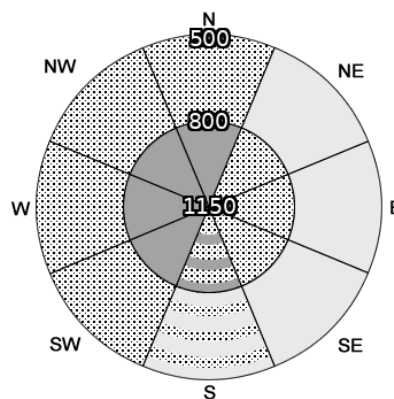


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 28/03/2013****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Snowpack instabilities will persist on Southerly through West to Northerly aspects above 800 metres particularly on steep convex terrain. Moderately bonded snow will exist on steeper terrain at lower altitudes. Surface instabilities will affect steep sun exposed slopes. Cornices will be weak. Wind exposed terrain mostly on Easterly aspects will remain firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Light snow showers are expected to continue on light Easterly winds. It will be freezing at all levels with a brief rise to 200 metres during the day.

Comments

Deep soft accumulations in sheltered lee areas, good ski touring however tricky in poor vis due to large banks/drifts of snow with serious drop off potential.
