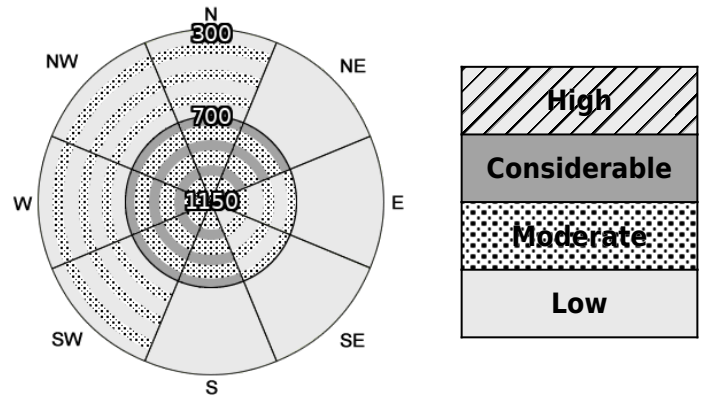
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected in the complex and variable snow pack. Accumulations of windslab of variable hardness and stability will exist on South-West through West to North aspects above 700 metres. On other aspects the snowpack consists of a mixture of scoured stable areas with patches of windslab. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain dry with light Easterly winds. After an overnight frost the freezing level will rise to 300 metres.
