

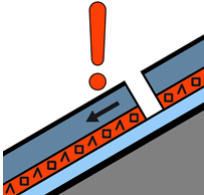

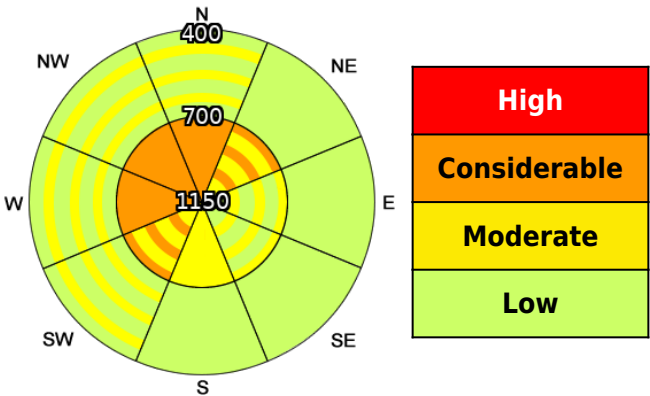
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected in the complex and variable snowpack. A persistent weak layer of sugary facets will persist and continue to develop within the snowpack. Areas of poor and moderately bonded windslab of varying firmness will be present on mainly South-West through West to North aspects. Other aspects may have more localised instabilities. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry conditions will prevail with fresh East to South-Easterly winds. Freezing at all levels overnight then rising to around 600 metres during the day.

Comments

Dry and settled conditions will continue to maintain instabilities within the snowpack. However, with good route finding and route choice, great climbing conditions exist.
