

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 03/04/2013


Avalanche Problems



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected in the snowpack, isolated instabilities will persist in mainly very steep slopes and convex terrain above 900 metres on West to North aspects, and here also some new isolated deposits may form. Elsewhere the snowpack will be moderately well bonded with steep wind sheltered locations where deep snow has accumulated being most affected. Many areas remain scoured and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight the wind will be Easterly and generally light with the occasional snow flurry, freezing at all levels. During the day some snow showers are possible, winds will be East-North-Easterly and the freezing level will rise to 600 metres.
