

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 08/04/2013


Avalanche Problems



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Snowpack weaknesses will persist mainly in steep and convex terrain on West to North aspects above 1000 metres. New accumulations may develop on these aspects mostly around corrie rims. Surface instabilities will affect areas of steep terrain especially on sun exposed slopes above 950 metres. Elsewhere the snowpack will be generally well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snowfall is expected overnight then dry during the day. Light South-East winds may increase a little during the day. It will be freezing at all levels overnight then rising to 450 metres during the day.

Comments

Excellent snow for ski touring apart from the poor visibility.
