

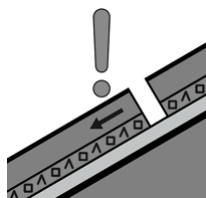

Avalanche Problems



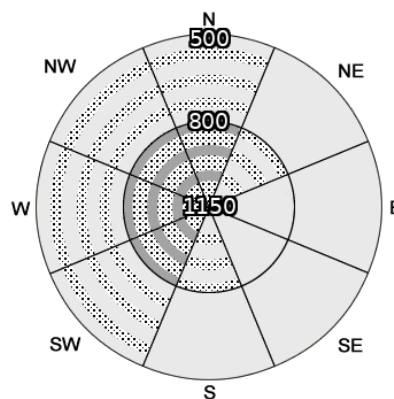
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further precipitation and redistribution of existing deposits will continue to form poor to weakly bonded windslab on South-West through West to North aspects from 800 metres. Deepest amounts will be found in steeper, sheltered locations such as gully exits and corrie rims. Other aspects will be mostly well bonded with localised areas of moderately bonded snow on steeper slopes. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow showers are possible throughout the period. Moderate to strong East-South-Easterly winds. Overnight freezing level 400 metres rising to 700 metres during the day.

Comments

Distribution of windslab varied but deepest amount in steeper, sheltered locations.
