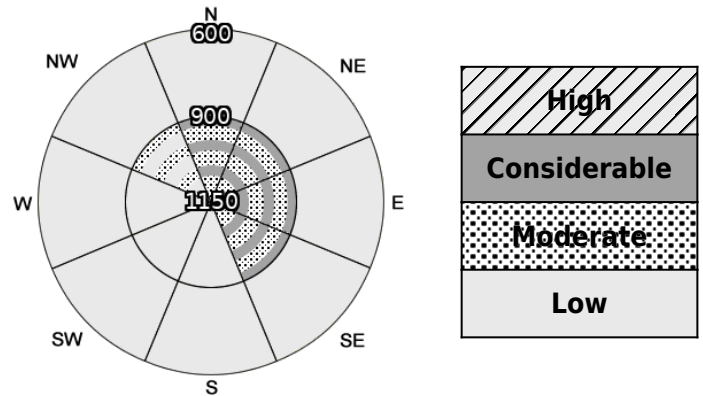

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New accumulations of windslab will develop on North through East to South-East facing slopes above 900 metres particularly around corrie rims and gully tops. Cross loading will affect other aspects and wind exposed slopes will be mostly stable. New fragile cornices will develop. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Sleet will turn to more significant snowfall overnight, this will then become showery during the morning. Winds will be strong South-Westerly then West-South-Westerly and the freezing level will lower to 1000 metres.
