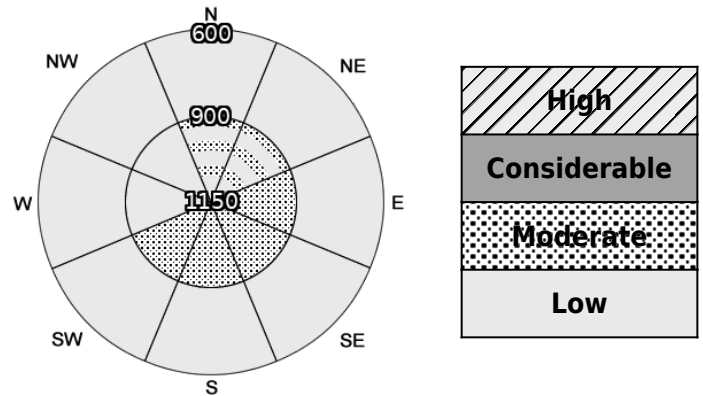
**Avalanche Problems**

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Localised areas of moderately bonded windslab are expected on many aspects above 900 metres, East through South to South-Westerly aspects mostly affected. These areas of windslab are not expected to be particularly deep or extensive. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Showers early in the night will soon die out. It will remain dry until toward the end of the forecast period when some light snow is expected. Overnight the freezing level will drop from 750 to 500 metres, rising again during the evening. Northerly winds will ease through the period, then increasing strength West-South-West later.

**Comments**

Still lots of snow on higher summits in Glen Coe.
