

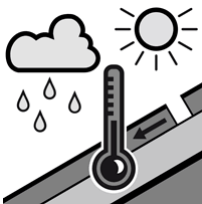

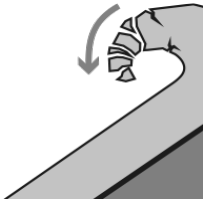

Wind Slab



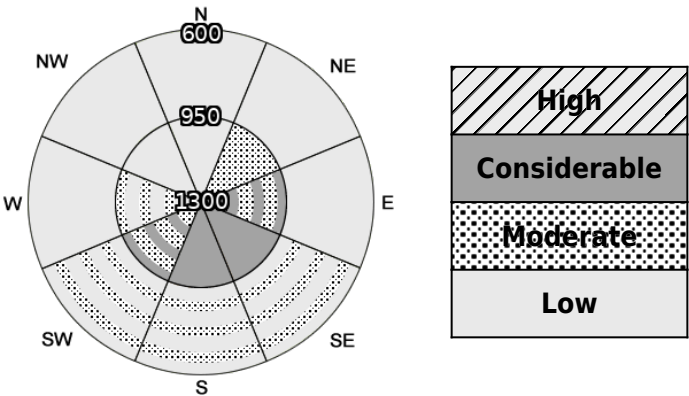

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A period of instability overnight as the temperatures rise significantly with avalanches likely on mainly East through South to South-Westerly aspects above 950 metres, here though cooler temperatures will then help to improve snowpack stability during the day. The snowpack elsewhere will generally be well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, the freezing level will rise to well above summit levels, winds very strong South-West then Westerly with sleet then snow showers. During the day the freezing level will gradually lower to 800 metres. Some sleet then snow showers expected. Winds remaining very strong Westerly.

Comments

A brief mild spell but wintry conditions persisting for the next while.
