

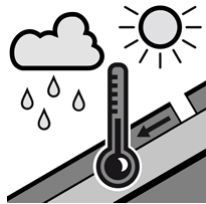

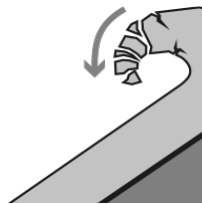

Wind Slab



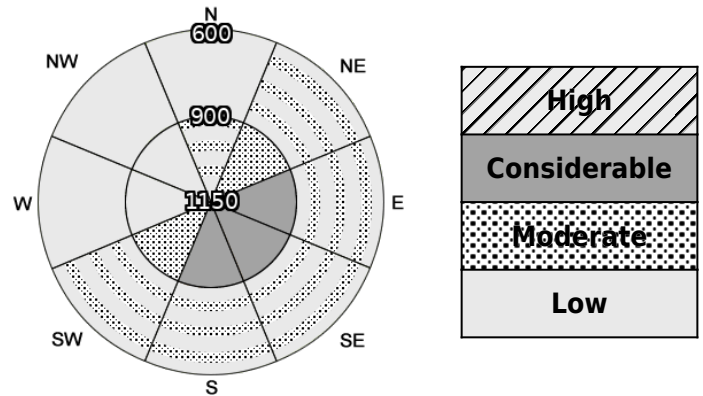

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be a period of instability as the freezing level rises. Later, the existing snowpack will then consolidate as the freezing level lowers. Through the day areas of fresh unstable windslab will be deposited on mainly East to South aspects above 900 metres. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight snow will turn to rain, and then back to snow again at higher levels as the freezing level briefly rises to 1700 metres. During the day heavy showers will initially fall as snow above 900 metres. The snow level will progressively drop to about 550 metres as the freezing level drops to around 800 metres. Winds will be strong North-Westerly.
