

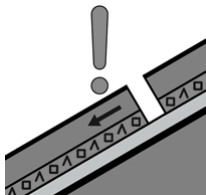

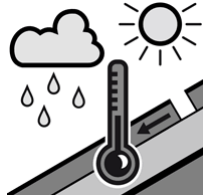

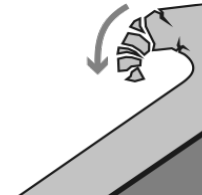
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers



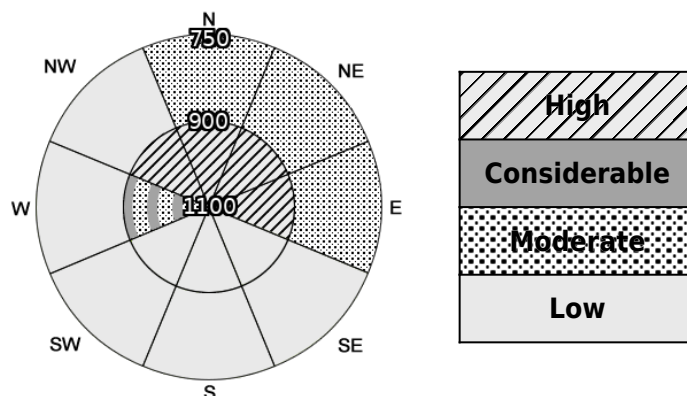

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow instabilities will persist with accumulations of poorly stabilised windslab on steep sheltered North-West through North to East aspects above 900m. Here, with the onset of any rain around summit levels there will be a period of poor stability and avalanches will occur. Elsewhere at lower elevations there will be some consolidation of the existing snowpack. Newly formed cornices will be fragile and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be High



Forecast Weather Influences

A cool showery Westerly airflow will bring further snow showers overnight as moderate winds back to become Southerly later. Freezing levels will rise slowly with some rain possible around summits toward the end of the period.
