Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A period of very poor stability and avalanche activity overnight on North-West through North to East slopes above 800m with long runouts possible. Further drifting will lead to the build up of additional weak windslab in these locations where avalanches will occur. Very large cornices will be weak and prone to sudden collapse. Better stability on all recently wind-soured slopes and exposed ridges. The avalanche hazard will be High



Forecast Weather Influences

Further snow showers throughout the period on very strong mainly South-West, later South-East winds. Freezing level rising to near summits overnight then progressively cooler during the day.

Comments

Little or no improvement expected in mountain conditions. Very careful and conservative route planning advised.
