

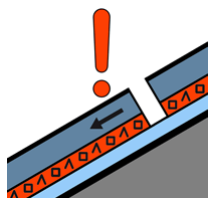

Wind Slab



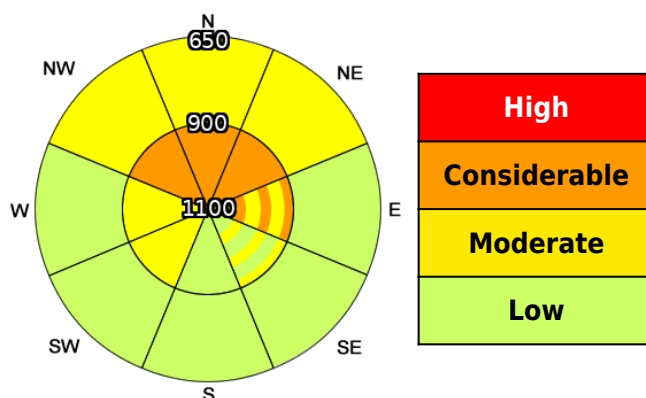
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of poorly stabilised windslab will be present at highest elevations above 900 metres on steep, sheltered, mostly North to Easterly aspects, with some cross-loading of other slopes in high, gully flanks, coire rims and in steep sheltered gully exits. Newly formed cornices remain unstable and prone to collapse. At lower elevations the snowpack although moist is generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Occasional snow showers overnight will mostly die away and become more isolated as the day progresses. Temperatures will remain cool throughout with snow lying above 400m. Variable light to fresh Westerly winds will initially will be SW then North Westerly for a period before again SW by end of the day.
