Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Above 900m there will be snow transportation and windslab development. Overnight, unstable windslab will form on sheltered South-East, South and South-West aspects. During the day windslab will develop on sheltered Easterly aspects above 900 metres. Below this altitude the snowpack will remain generally stable however localised wet snow surface instabilities will exist on steep slopes. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.


Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers above 850m are expected through out the period. The winds will be strong over the summits, initially North-Easterly overnight but slowly backing round to the North-West by the afternoon.
