

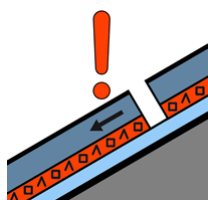

Wind Slab



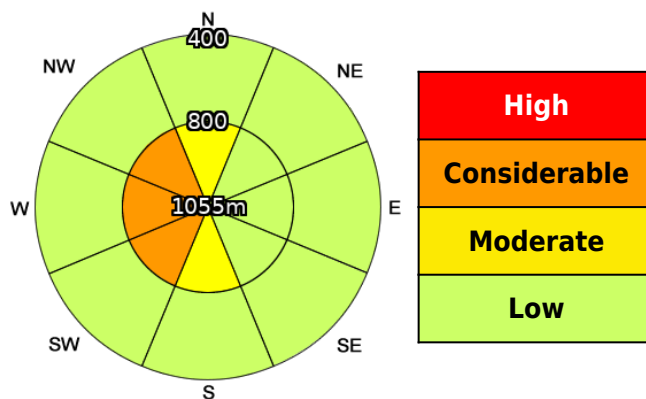
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded windslab will continue to build on sheltered mainly South-West, West and North-West facing slopes, particularly above 800m. Any new cornice development on these aspects will be weak, unstable and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Easterly winds are forecast to increase in strength overnight before moderating slightly by morning. The precipitation is also forecast to moderate by early morning. This will fall as snow above 400m. However during the night the freezing level will rise above the summits for a brief period before dropping back to 400m by early morning

Comments

Not a bad morning which deteriorated quickly as the front came through.
