

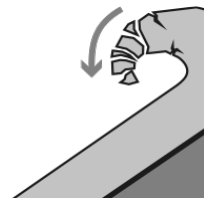

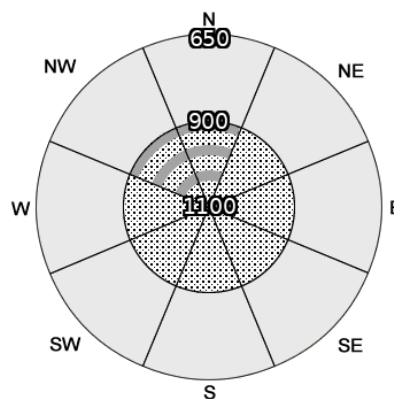
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fluctuating temperatures will aid consolidation and with a re-freeze of the existing snowpack above 800m the overall stability will improve. Below 700m the snowpack although remaining moist will be generally stable. Some localised instabilities are possible at highest elevations where new windblown accumulations develop on very steep mostly NW to North facing slopes and gullies above 900m. Large cornices around coire rims unpredictable and best avoided. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Mostly dry throughout the period although with the chance of a few isolated snow showers early morning. Very light generally Easterly winds. Freezing levels will lower overnight and during the day to around 800 metres.

Some improvement with return of cooler conditions and lighter winds
