

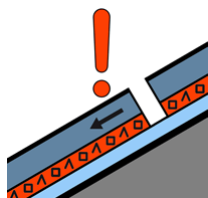

Wind Slab



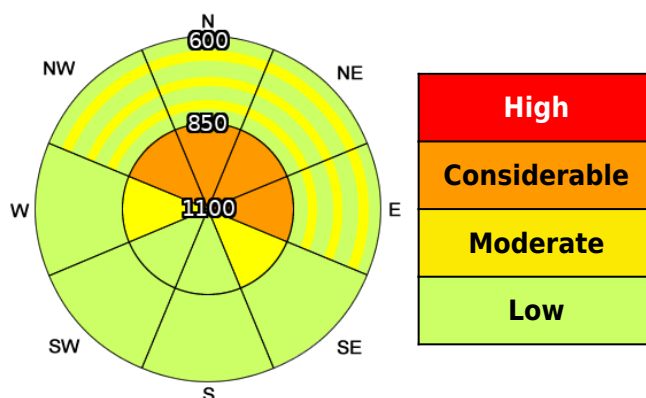

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Consolidation of recent accumulations and the old snowpack at lower elevations will continue and stability below 850m is generally improved. Weakly stabilised windslab will continue to develop above this with poorest stability on highest sheltered North-West through North to East aspects above 900m. Cross-loading onto steep gully flanks and exits of other aspects will also occur. All new cornice development will be soft and weak. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers will become more scattered and ease overnight. It will remain cool with freezing levels of around 600 to 700 metres, dipping to 400 metres overnight. Winds will remain moderate to fresh, generally South-Westerly.
