

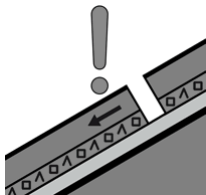

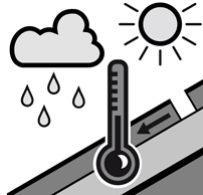

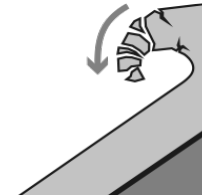
Wind Slab

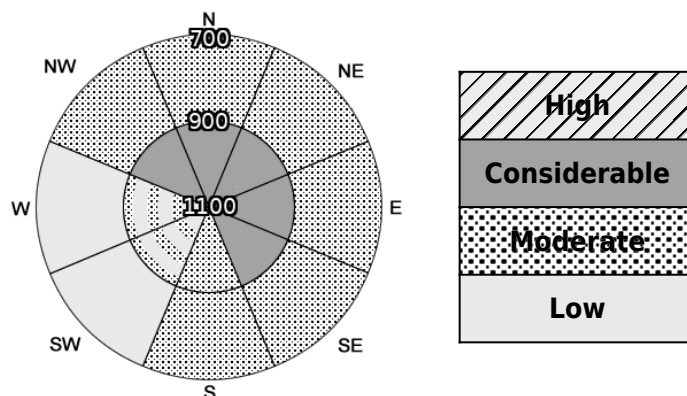

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Wet snow instabilities will persist initially, and new unstable windslab deposits will form on all North-West through North to South-East aspects above 800m, where avalanches are likely. Remaining cornice lines will be suspect. During the day there will be an improvement in stability in all locations with the onset of drier, cooler conditions. A little thin, soft, moderately bonded windslab possible on North to East aspects above 900m by day's end. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Slightly milder again for a brief period before becoming progressively cooler overnight with some snow showers during the day. Winds will be variable light to start freshening and becoming West-South-West.

Comments

Some instability coinciding again with a milder airflow for a period as a waving front clears eastwards overnight.
