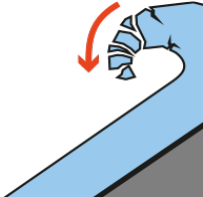

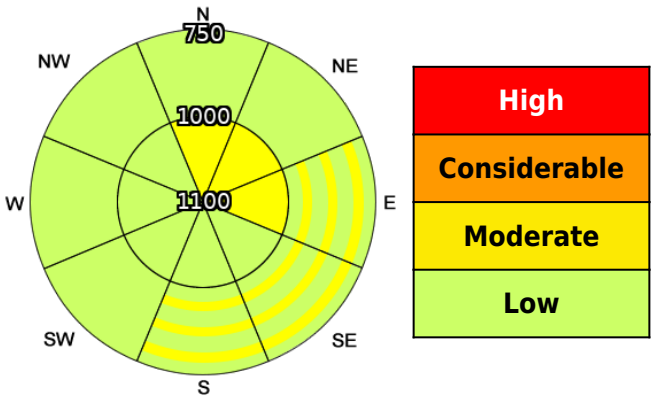

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will remain moist and reasonably well stabilized in most locations. Accumulations of humid, moderately bonded windslab with form on steep North to East aspects above 1000m. Potential for full depth avalanches will persist on selected steep East to South aspects below 850m. Diminishing hazard from collapse-prone old cornices on very steep North to South East-facing aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Becoming cooler with rain and sleety snowfall over summits and rain at lower levels. Strong West South Westerly winds.

Comments

Snow cover now much patchier after sustained thaw. Carn Liath plateau cover broken though better on Sron a Ghoire and Creag Meagaidh main massif. Rockfall a potential hazard in current conditions.
