

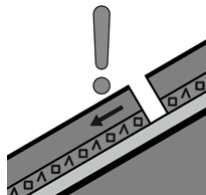

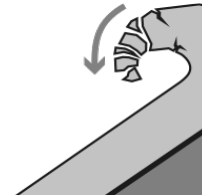

Wind Slab



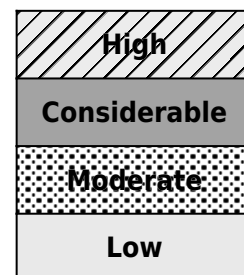
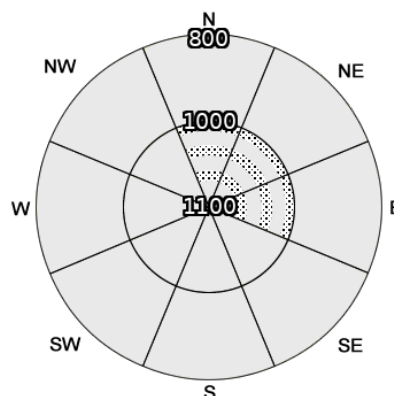
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will remain moist and well stabilised in most locations. Small accumulations of humid, moderately bonded windslab are possible on steepest, sheltered North to East aspects above 1000m, these instabilities in the main will be localised and largely avoidable. A hazard from sections of collapse-prone old cornices will persist on very steep North to South East-facing aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

A strong South Westerly airflow with freezing levels fluctuating again in and around summits will bring rain and some sleety snowfall on the tops.

Comments

Little change steady thaw conditions prevailing. Rockfall hazard in and around buttresses with some remaining large sections of slumped cornice lines still present.
