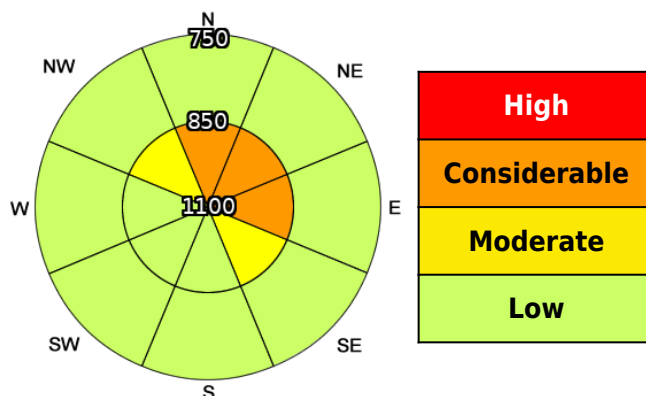

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Weakly stabilised windslab will continue to gain depth and become more widespread on all steep North to East aspects above 850m where avalanches are likely. Much colder temperatures will firm up the old moist snowpack in many locations. Good stability on all recently wind exposed aspects. All recently formed cornices will be weak and prone to sudden collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Becoming much colder with frequent snow showers through the period. Winds will be strong West South Westerly, later South Westerly and easing a little late in the day.

Comments

Thin covering of fresh snow down to 700m with deeper drifts developing above 900m. Wintry couple of days in prospect.
