

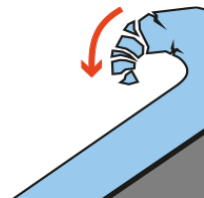

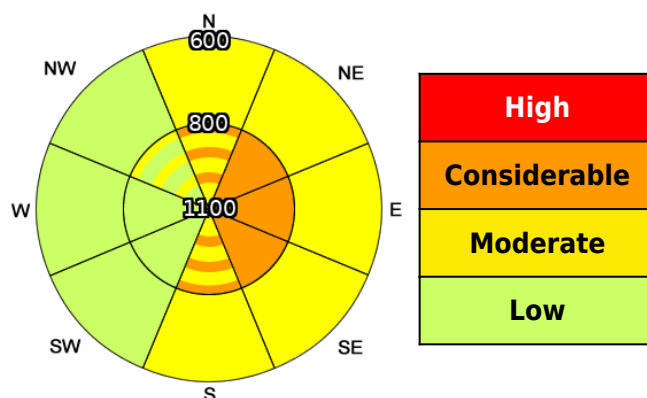
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow instabilities will develop with areas of marginally stabilised windslab on steep, mostly North East to Easterly aspects above 800m, there will be some cross loading on other aspects especially on steep sheltered gully flanks and exits. Further poorly stabilised cornice development will continue on the steep coire backwalls of these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Fluctuating temperatures late evening becoming colder overnight, with a showery airflow bringing snow showers by early morning. The showers will persist throughout the day accompanied by strong to storm force West South Westerly winds
