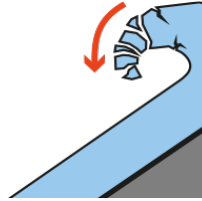

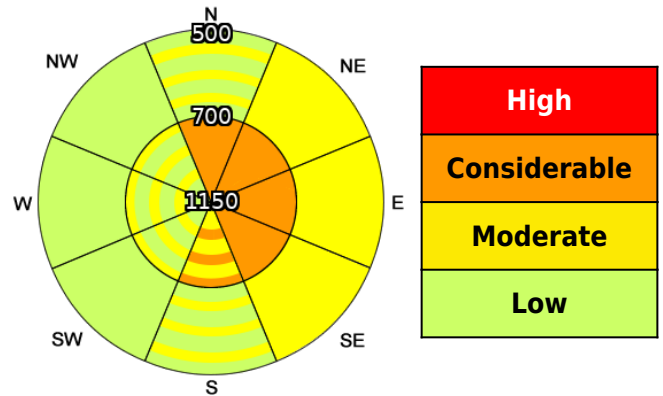

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Windslab, which exists mainly on North through East to South-East aspects above 700 metres, will become increasingly unstable as heavy rainfall affects all levels. Wet snow instabilities will be present and avalanches are likely on these aspects. Instabilities will also exist on other aspects and altitudes. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

The freezing level will rise above the summits this evening and then heavy rain will fall at all levels for the rest of the forecast period. Winds will be very strong mainly South-Westerly.

**Comments**

After a nice day today (Saturday) tomorrow is expected to be very wet with nearly 3 inches of rain forecast for Glen Coe.
