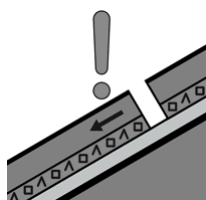
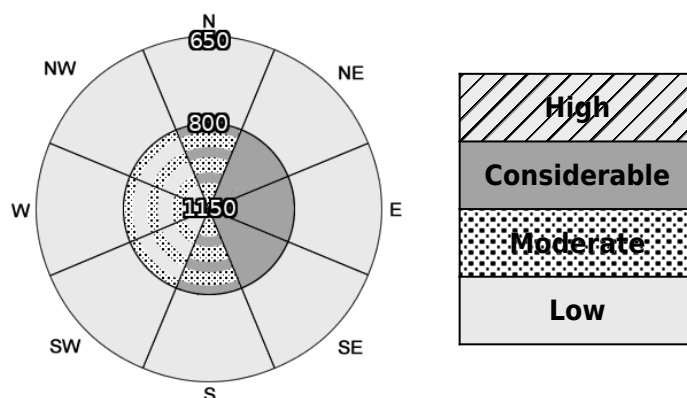

The existing snowpack will start to stabilise when the temperature falls. Some fresh accumulations of unstable windslab will form on North-East to South-East aspects and peripheral slopes, mainly above 800 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Becoming colder overnight with the freezing level falling below the summits by the morning. Showers, falling as snow above 500/600 metres overnight and during the day. Strong Westerly winds throughout.

Comments

Heavy thaw has raised snow line to about 650 metres on North to South-Easterly aspects, higher on others.
