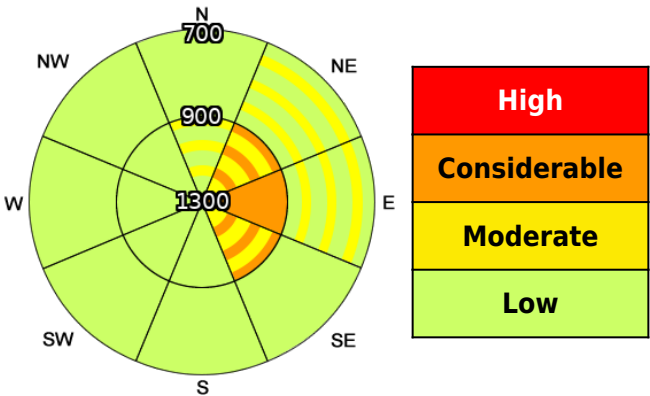

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight snow fall will continue to accumulate poorly bonded windslab onto isolated locations on mainly North - East to Easterly aspects above 900 metres, with wind sheltered, hollows, corrie rims and gully exits being most affected. Gully flanks and other areas will be affected due to cross loading. Windward, mainly Westerly slopes will remain bare of snow. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall, sometimes heavy will continue into the night, dying out in the early hours then for the rest of the forecast period. West-North-West winds easing by morning becoming Westerly. Freezing level around 600 metres.

Comments

A bright Christmas day expected, but with localised poor accumulations on easterly slopes. Have a good Christmas.
