

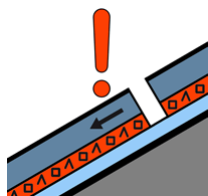

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to build on South-East to South-Westerly aspects mainly above 850 metres, with steep wind sheltered locations, such as coire back walls and gully tops most affected. During the day some snow will be redistributed into isolated places on Northerly to Easterly slopes where unstable windslab will continue to develop, with steep convex slopes most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable

Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight strong Northerly winds with snow fall, backing West then easing to South-Westerly during the day. A dry day expected. Freezing levels around 600 metres.
