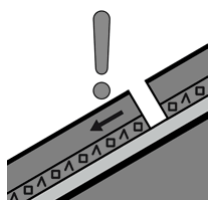


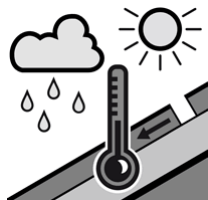

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 04/01/2015

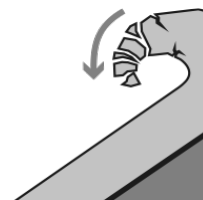

Persistent Weak Layers



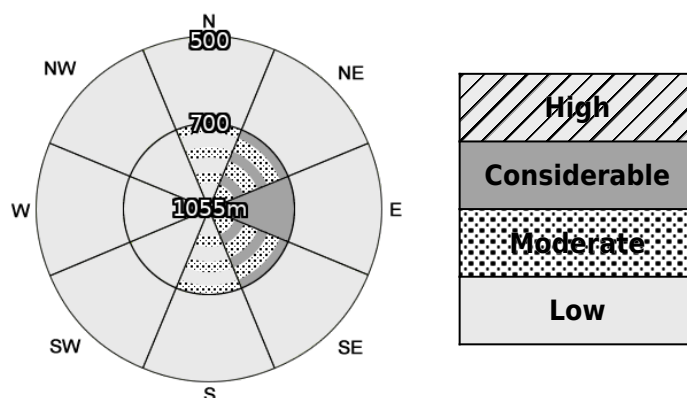

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Snowpack instabilities will exist in areas of steep and convex terrain especially during the rise in temperature. North-East to South-Easterly aspects above 700 metres will be most affected, additionally pockets of Instability on other aspects where recent windslab deposits have formed will also be affected. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow flurries are expected followed by light rain at all levels as the freezing level rises above the summits during the morning. The afternoon is expected to be dry. Strong West-North-West winds will back to the South-West.
