

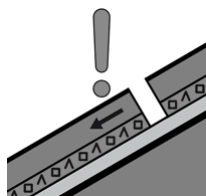

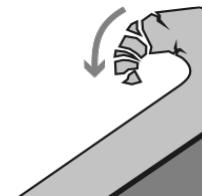

Wind Slab



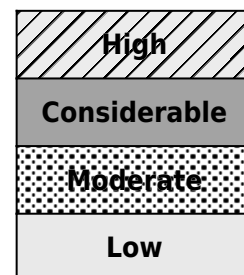
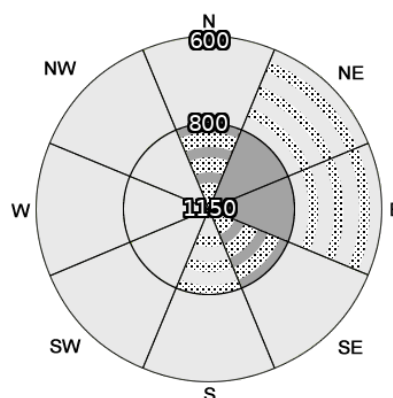

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will start to re-freeze and consolidate overnight in most locations. New snow will form unstable windslab in sheltered locations such as summit gullies and on slopes with a North through East to South-Easterly aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. Fresh cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Rain initially overnight will turn to snow above 500 metres as colder conditions return. Winds will be fresh to strong Westerly backing South-Westerly by evening. Snow showers are expected throughout the day.

Comments

Milder conditions have reduced the snow cover at lower levels. Snowpack generally softening and moist. Colder outlook for tomorrow with snow. Fresh cornices will be prone to collapse.
