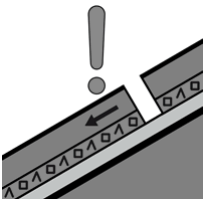


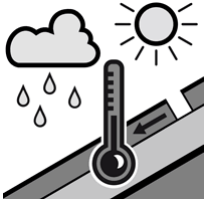

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 07/01/2015

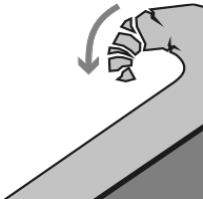

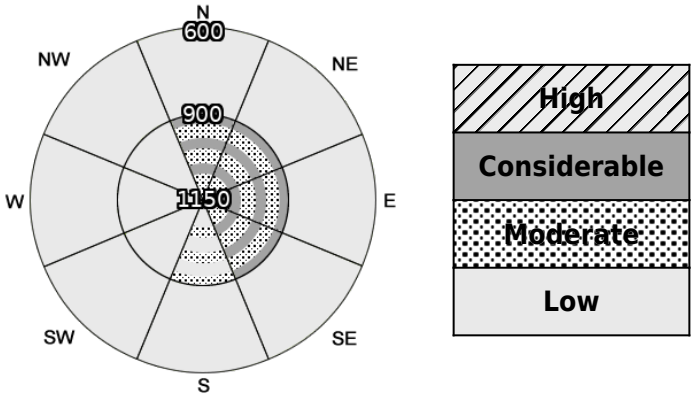

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Snow accumulations overnight will be low. During the day the snowpack will become softer and more moist at all levels. Generally it will remain well bonded. Wet snow instabilities will develop in areas of windslab that exist in gullies and on sheltered slopes on North through East to South-Easterly aspects, mainly above 900 metres. Large cornices will become unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The wind will be strong increasing to gale force through the day from a South-Westerly direction. Precipitation falling as very light snow showers overnight will turn to persistent rain showers throughout the day. The freezing level will rise gradually overnight becoming well above the tops through the day.

Comments

Thaw conditions will lead to some wet snow instabilities in the snowpack. Freezing level will peak at over 2000 metres at midday - cooling through the afternoon. Storm force gusts through the day.
