



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Pockets of moderately bonded windslab will continue to develop overnight in high sheltered, lee North-East to South-Easterly aspects above 800m. The stability of these localised accumulations will deteriorate during the day with avalanches likely with the onset of rain which will be heavier around midday. Any recent cornice development in these aspects will be weak and liable to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Cool overnight with a few scattered snow showers, these turning to rain as freezing levels rise above summits by mid morning before lowering again to around summits later in the afternoon. The winds will be very strong South-Westerly throughout
