
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poor stability overnight with initial improvement as the snowpack re-freezes in all locations and altitudes. Localised marginally-bonded windslab will develop only on steep and very sheltered North-East to South-East-facing slopes and gullies above 800m. Stability will remain good on all recently re-frozen, scoured locations. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Persistent rainfall at all levels overnight and into the early hours. Much milder temperatures will be displaced by very cold air and persistent snowfall throughout the day. Winds will be very strong and turbulent Westerly.

Comments

Thin cover of fresh snow down to 500m. Very stormy last night with heavy scouring evident even on lee aspects.
