

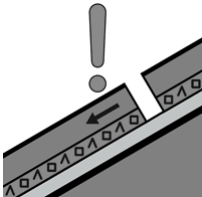

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 11/01/2015

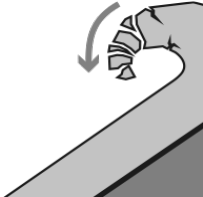
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



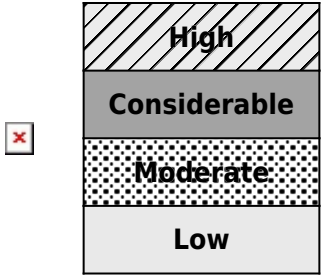
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised accumulations of poor to weakly bonded windslab will continue to develop above 850 metres mainly on sheltered North-East to South-East aspects and here avalanches are likely. North and South aspects will also be affected by cross-loading. Westerly aspects will be scoured and bare. Unstable cornices will continue to develop. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight snow will be light but becoming heavier with the freezing level rising to the summits during the day. Gale force winds will be mostly from the West.

Comments

Snow cover remains skeletal with deeper accumulations only where very sheltered.
