

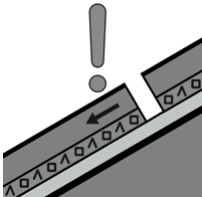

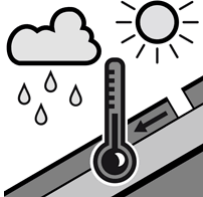

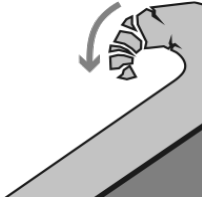
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers



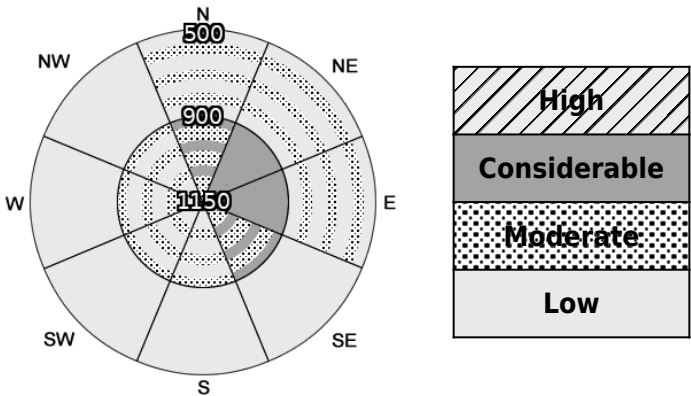

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop in many sheltered locations. The greatest accumulations will be on North-East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Cross loading will affect other aspects particularly sheltered gullies and the exits. Wet snow instabilities will exist below 900 metres as the freezing level rises. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong Westerly winds will continue through the period. Overnight, snow showers mainly above 200 metres, during the day precipitation will become more persistent and heavy at times. The freezing level will rise to around summit levels with rain below 900 metres by the end of the day.

Comments

After a period of snow during the day it will become milder with rain below 900 metres. Returning to colder conditions on Monday and Tuesday.
