

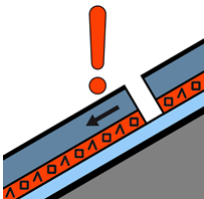

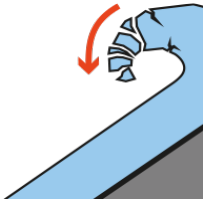
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers



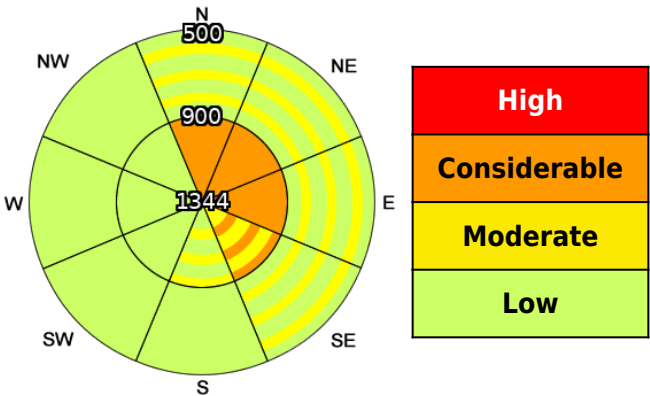

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to be deposited in sheltered areas, mainly on North through East to South-East aspects above 900 metres where avalanches are likely. At lower levels the surface of the old wet snowpack will refreeze during the day and there will be some fresh deposits of windslab. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be very strong, South-Westerly overnight, West-South-Westerly during the day. During the night the freezing level will be around 1000 metres with snowfall above 900 metres, then it will drop during the early morning to around 400 metres through the day with snow showers.
