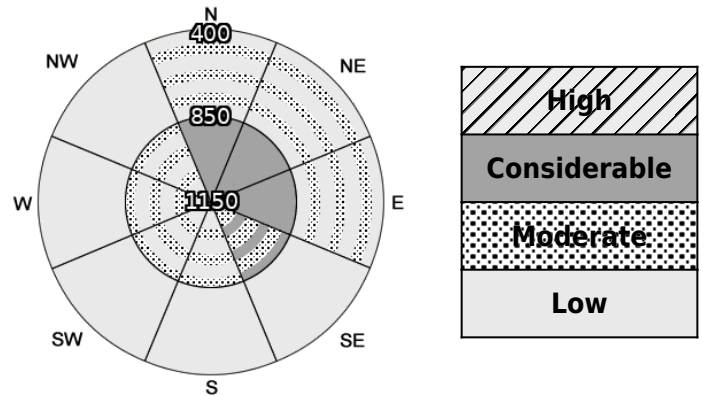

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Accumulations of poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop on steep and sheltered North through East to South-East-facing slopes and in gullies, primarily above 850m. Cross loading is likely onto other aspects particularly steep sheltered gully flanks and lee locations. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining cold, with the freezing dropping to all levels. The winds will continue to be strong South-Westerly but easing slightly with snow showers through the period heavy at times.

Comments

Crossing, turbulent airflows will bring varying amounts of new snow some will be heavy others just a dusting.
