

Wind Slab





Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further accumulations of new, poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop on steep and sheltered North through East to South-East-facing slopes and gullies, primarily above 800m with some cross loading of other aspects in steep gully flanks and lee locations. In particularly steep, sheltered locations below ridgelines where these accumulations form in deepest convex bands avalanches are likely. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

A cold showery West to South-Westerly airflow will continue to bring further snow showers to all levels with freezing levels varying from 600m down to 200m. Winds will remain very strong to gale force on summits.

Wild wintry conditions persist giving limited opportunity for high level winter sport.
