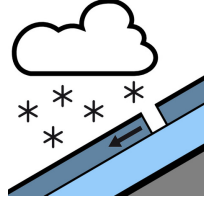

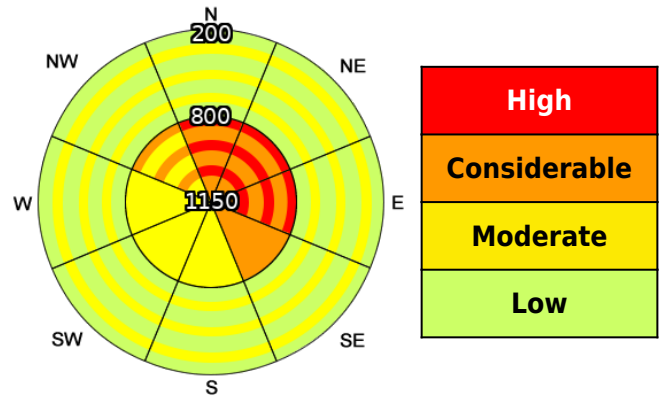

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Deep accumulations of weakly bonded windslab will continue to develop in most sheltered areas. Areas particularly affected, North through East to South-East-facing slopes and in gullies, primarily above 800m where avalanches will occur. Cross loading will take place onto other aspects particularly steep sheltered gully flanks and lee locations. Cornices, weak and fragile. The avalanche hazard will be High.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

The cold showery South-Westerly airstream will continue to affect the area with frequent and heavy snow showers. Drifting will continue with blizzard conditions. The winds will be strong mainly from the South-West, the freezing level will rise to around 450 metres.

**Comments**

Deep unconsolidated snow above 600 metres with a lot of drifting taking place..
