

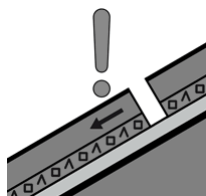

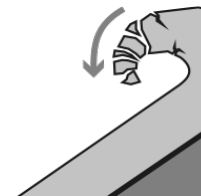
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



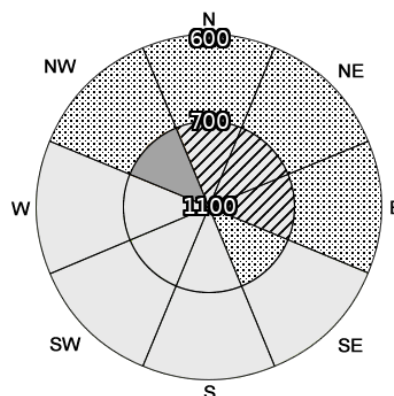
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Very poor stability on North-West through North to East aspects above 700m where avalanches will occur. Period of poorest stability expected to be overnight but avalanche hazard will rise again during the day as snowfall continues. All cornices will become weak and prone to spontaneous collapse. Slopes and ridges directly exposed to recent wind scouring will be well stabilised. The avalanche hazard will be High



Forecast Weather Influences

Heavy snowfall overnight and during the day. Winds will be very strong South-East later South-Westerly. Freezing level spiking at 750m overnight then falling during the day.

Comments

Deep complete snow cover at glen level. Low altitude windward slopes also carrying reasonable cover though heavy scouring and drifting above 600m. Limited access.
