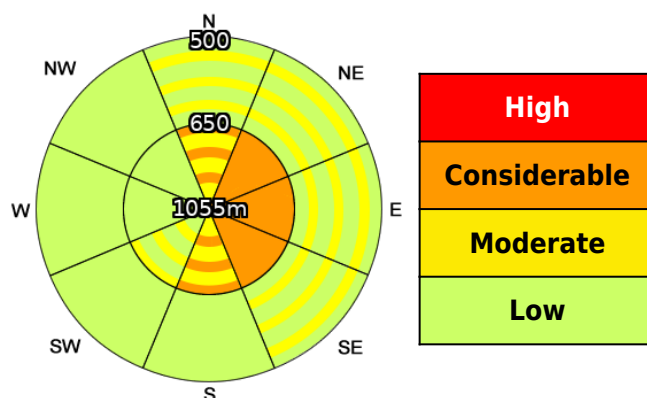

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Accumulations of poorly bonded windslab will become more widespread with areas most affected North-East to South-East aspects above 650 metres. Windslab will also accumulate on other aspects in sheltered locations mainly in gully tops and steep coire headwalls. Cornices will continue to develop and become unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

The wind will ease overnight and back from West to South-South-West during the day. Snow and snow showers will continue through the forecast period and the freezing level will remain at 200 metres.

Comments

Breakable crust up to 700m with areas of deep fresh snow. The ridges and summits generally remain clear of snow.
