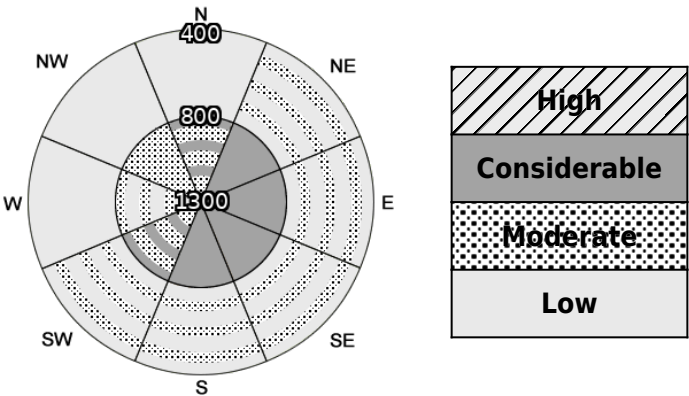

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Weakly bonded windslab will develop on East through South to South-West aspects above 800 metres. A variation of localised and more widespread instabilities will also affect steep, sheltered North-West through North to North-East aspects due to existing weaknesses and cross loading. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall overnight on strong then moderate North-North-West winds. During the day its expected to be dry with light to moderate Southerly winds.

Comments

A variable cold snowpack with pockets of instability in many areas, widespread windslab accumulations, and expanses of firm windblown snow.
