

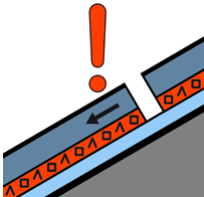

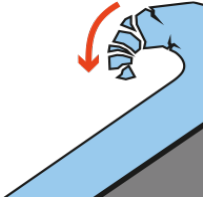

Wind Slab



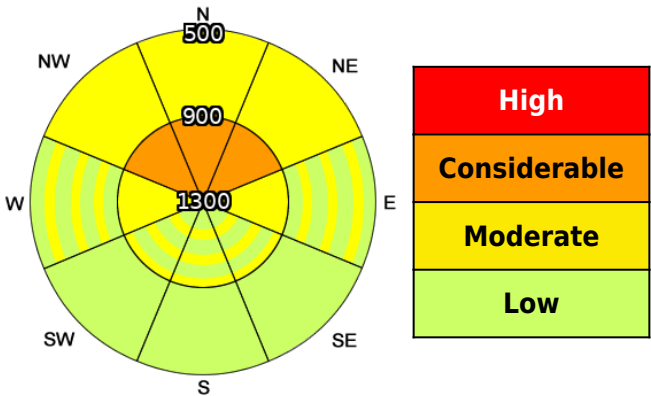
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Snow stability will gradually improve, but poorly bonded hard windslab will persist in steep locations on North-West to North-Easterly aspects mainly above 900 metres, with steep convex terrain, coire rims and gully exits most affected. Cross loading will affect West and East aspects also. Above 500 metres moderately bonded accumulations will be present in steep wind sheltered localised places. Many wind exposed areas scoured and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

A cold dry day is expected. Winds moderate strength South-South-East veering South-South-Westerly in the day. Freezing levels around 700 metres.
