

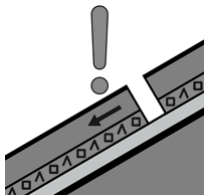

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 24/01/2015

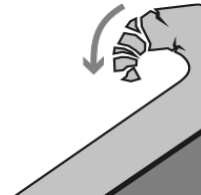
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



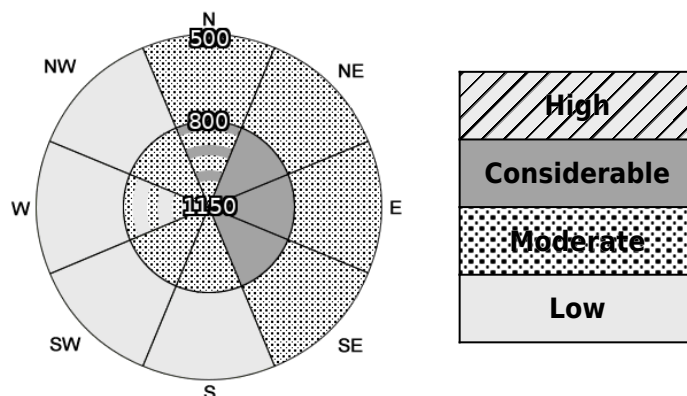
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Existing snow will refreeze and mostly consolidate. However, new unstable windslab will develop on steep, sheltered features such as gully exits and scarp slopes mostly on North-East to South-East aspects above 800 metres. Other aspects, particularly Northerly, will be affected by cross-loading. Cornices will remain a significant hazard. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will drop to around 400 metres before lifting slightly. There will be snow showers overnight and through until early afternoon. Gale force winds mostly from the West.

Comments

Some snow loss at lower levels but still good above 600 metres.
