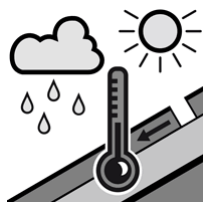

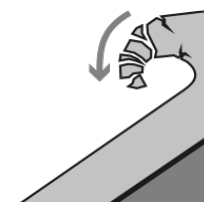

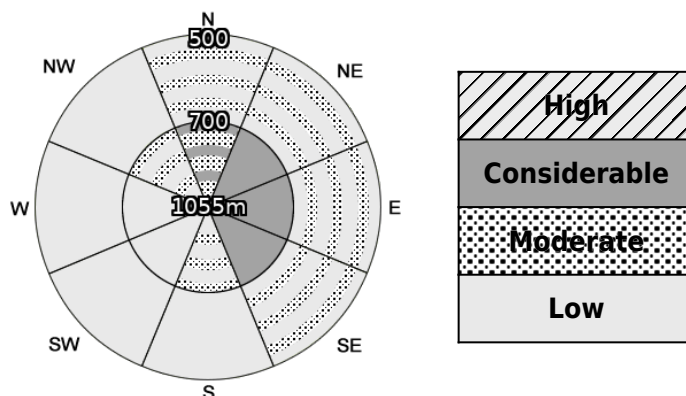

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will become wet and unstable from rain and rising temperatures. Where recent accumulations are greatest, mainly on North East to South East aspects above 700 metres avalanches are likely. Cornices will be unstable and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong South Westerly winds overnight will increase in strength with gusts up to 90 mph during the day. Overnight showers of sleet will turn to rain at all levels as the freezing level rises to 2500 metres before falling back to summit levels by evening.

Comments

Much of Liathach scoured with good build up of ice on both North and South aspects. More snow towards the East end of Beinn Eighe. Very mild on Monday but cooler by evening.
