

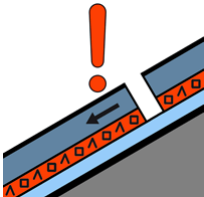

Avalanche Problems



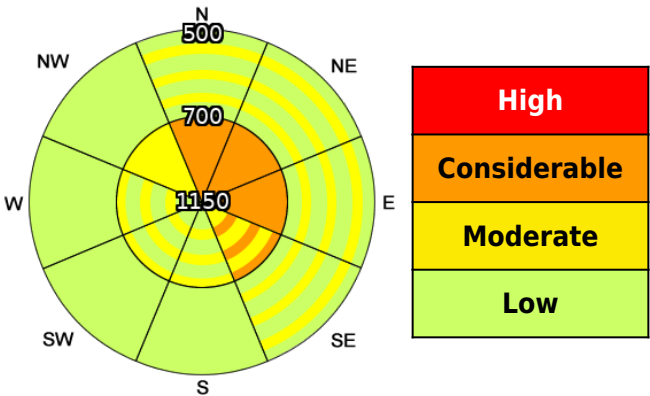
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing wet snowpack will refreeze and consolidate. New areas of weakly bonded windslab will form mainly on steep North-East to South-East aspects above 800m. Cross loading will affect other sheltered locations particularly gully flanks and scarp slopes on Northerly aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will fall to around 500 metres, the rain will turn to snow showers during the night and continue through much of the day. Westerly winds will be strong with gusts reaching gale force at times.

Comments

Changeable weather till Thursday - Gales and snowfall for the early part of this week then getting colder on Thursday.
