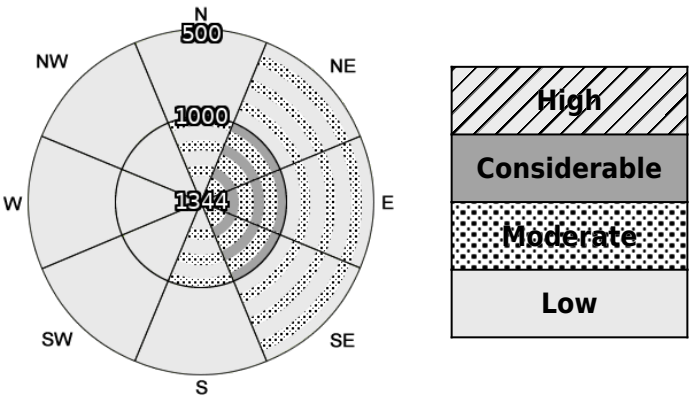
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will freeze and stabilise in the colder conditions. Through the day areas of fresh unstable windslab will be deposited on North-East to South-East aspects above 1000 metres. These areas are not expected to be extensive, with coire rims and the tops of gullies being most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight the freezing level will drop to around 600 metres where it will remain through the day. Snow showers overnight and through the morning will die out during the afternoon. Winds will be from the West.

Comments

The existing snowpack likely to become very hard and icy when it freezes, with serious run out potential.
