

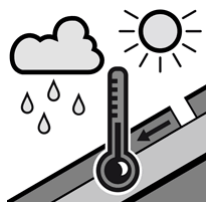

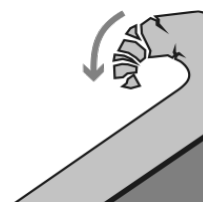

Wind Slab



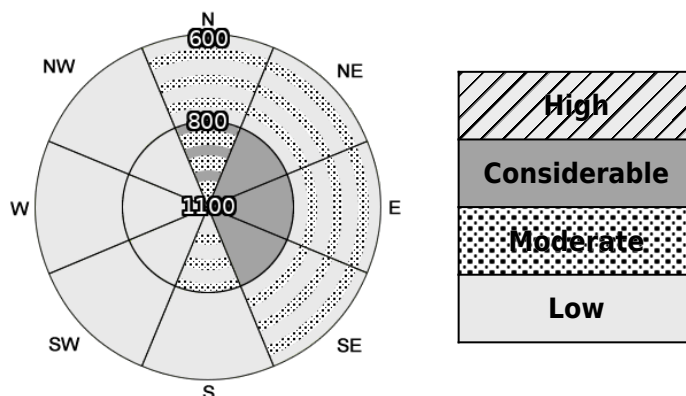

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh windslab will continue to form on mainly North-East to South-Easterly aspects above 800m and stability of accumulations in sheltered gully flanks and exits will deteriorate especially with the onset of midday rain, here avalanches are likely. Better stability on all scoured and exposed ridges. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Freezing levels will spike above summits, as snow showers turn to rain below 900m during the day. Cooler conditions are then set to return towards the end of the period. Winds will be moderate to strong Westerly becoming South-West.

Comments

Little bit more than a dusting of fresh snow on high ground. Poor visibility between showers throughout the day.
