

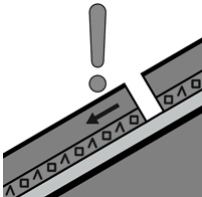

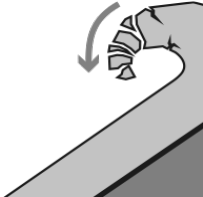

Wind Slab



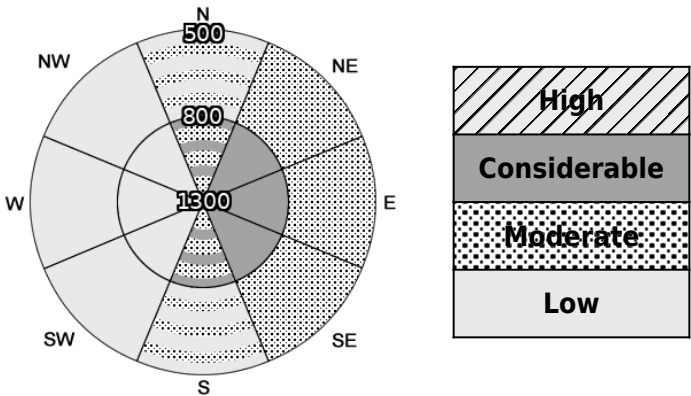
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to build, with deepest accumulations on North-East to South-Easterly aspects above 800 metres, here avalanche are likely, with Corrie back walls, gullies and scarp slopes most affected. Below this level and mainly above 500 metres, on the same aspects, localised unstable accumulations will form in steep wind sheltered locations. Cross loading will also effect North and South aspects. Cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Very strong Westerly winds will continue throughout the forecast period. Freezing level around 200 metres. Snow showers throughout the day to valley levels.
