

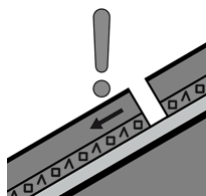

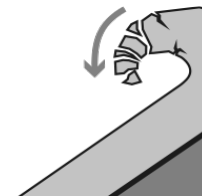
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



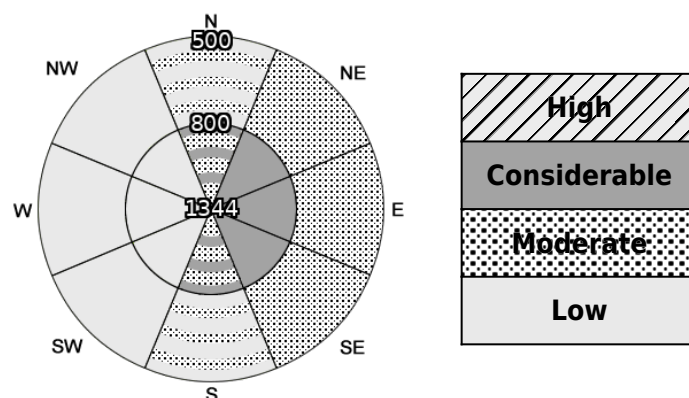
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to be deposited on North-East to South-East aspects, particularly at the top of slopes and gullies above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. Although some sheltered locations on other aspects will be affected due to cross loading, exposed windward aspects will generally be scoured and stable. Cornices will be soft and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain cold with a freezing level of around 300 metres. Snow showers will continue overnight and through the day. Strong Westerly winds will ease slightly.

Comments

Conditions expected to remain cold with daily snowfall until at least the weekend.
