

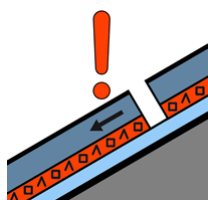

Wind Slab



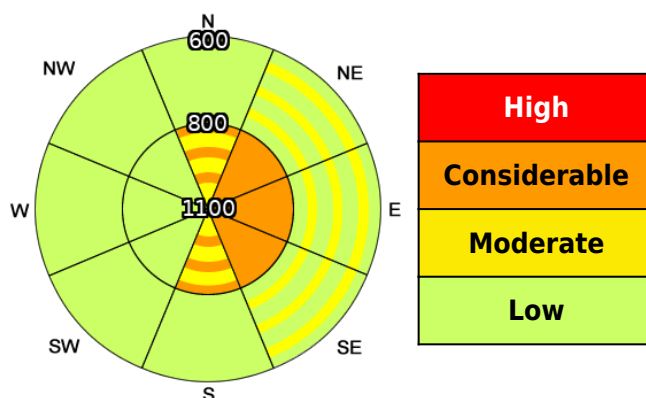
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further new, weakly bonded windslab development will take place on mainly North-East to South-East aspects above 800m where avalanches are likely. Cross-loading will also occur in steep gully flanks and exits on some sheltered North and South aspects. New weak cornices will grow over steepest lee slopes. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining wintry with further snow showers, some heavy at times with strong Westerly, then easing West North Westerly winds.

Comments

Mountain obs difficult today with wintry conditions and egress to high ground hampered by old, deep wet snow at lower elevations.
